### **Positive Covid Cases this Week**

As you know, we have unfortunately had confirmed positive cases this week in school. Thank you to those families and staff who took a PCR test to check, even if your child did not have symptoms.

A reminder from the letter we sent out on Monday:

If your child is awaiting a PCR test result and has **NO SYMPTOMS** - they **DO NOT** need to isolate and **SHOULD** attend school as normal while awaiting the result.

If your child is awaiting a PCR test result and **DOES HAVE SYMPTOMS** or is feeling unwell – they <u>DO</u> need to isolate until they receive a negative result and **SHOULD NOT** attend school as normal.

I absolutely understand that the ever-changing guidance can be very confusing, but we are working closely with Public Health Dorset to ensure that we have the most up to date information and guidance.

Please remember our priority is, as it always has been, to keep our children, staff and families safe. We have a lot of children with coughs, snuffles and illnesses at the moment and the positive cases we have had, have not shown any of the main symptoms identified as COVID.

If you have any concerns, please do contact the School Office where we are very happy to talk it through with you. In the meantime, sending hugs (albeit virtual) to the members of our school community who are isolating at home and looking forward to seeing you soon!

## **Hedgehogs News**

This week in Hedgehogs we have been looking at part-part whole in Maths. The children were very good at identify what a part and a whole was (especially when we linked it to food!). In English, we have been carrying on our Traction Man journey story. This week we have been thinking about the "Fat Fingers" coming to get the scrubbing brush. We had a mission to find the fat fingers around school and print the pictures, just like Traction Man and the Mysterious Toes. For PE, we have continued thinking about what exercise does to our body to stay fit and healthy. We have been feeling our heart beat before PE, doing star jumps, jumping side to side, skipping and throwing and catching balls, then comparing it. They were beating very fast!

In Forest School Hedgehogs made stick people. They tried really hard to use wire and rubber bands to fix on the hair, clothing and leaves. They whittled the sticks with vegetable peelers to create faces and drew them on with felt tips.

Squirrels have been very excited about planning their own version of the journey story, Traction Man, in English this week. We worked out our main characters, our evil enemies and the journey the characters took through the classroom. The children have started writing their stories, trying to follow their plan and we will continue these next week. In maths, we have consolidated our understanding of tens and ones, continuing to use part-part whole models and reasoning. Our Rugby session this week helped us focus on kindness and remembering to be aware of our values in everything we do. We also completed some artwork, linking our rugby sessions to our school values and faith. In topic, we made kites with Mrs Shean and were very excited as we walked home and the wind caught them! In Science, we have been learning about how humans adapt to different seasons as well as the different foods available across each season. In RE we have looked artists representations of the creation story and we have started learning our harvest song ready for next Thursday afternoon's Harvest Festival celebration in church. We had a fabulous day making wattle and daube, weaving textiles and shooting arrows. We also enjoyed going inside a Viking longhouse and learning how to make a fire. Thank you to all the adults who helped make this trip possible for us. It was also exciting for the children going on a coach after not being able to do school trips for such a long amount of time. In Science we made our own compasses by charging a paperclip with a magnet and floating it on top of a leaf in water. We edited and improved our quest stories this week in English with a focus on descriptive phrases. We enjoyed sharing our ideas with each other and trying to imagine different scenes.

In maths we practised adding a single-digit number by making another ten. We had lots of persevering penguins but also 'Proud Puffins' when we finally managed to do it - well done Badgers.

# Foxes News

This week the children in Foxes have been Coding in our computing lesson. They all enjoyed using Code.org to debug programmes by giving clear and precise instructions, as well as identifying errors in pre-written codes. We are going to continue this over the next few weeks, with the children moving on to creating sequential algorithms.

In Maths the children have been solving addition and subtraction problems using the column methods. They had to answer questions involving 4 and 5-digit numbers, look for mistakes in questions, draw bar models to represent calculations as well as explaining how they got their answers. We had lots of "Reasoning Robins" in class.

Finally, it was another exciting session of Forest School with Ms Rankin on Tuesday. This week the children made wooden mallets. They safely used bow saws to cut part way through the wood, before using a whittling knife to finish it off. A BIG thank you to all the parents and grandparents who came in and supported the children.
