Our priority in school is to keep all our children safe whilst they are at school.

Therefore, please inform the office of your contact details, home time arrangements or if your child's medical needs have changed so we can update our records.



Free School Meals

Please can I encourage parents to apply for Free School Meals, if you are eligible? You do not have to have the meals but eligibility may mean that some trips are significantly cheaper for these families, and children eligible for Free School Meals attract additional funding to the school (which is important at this time of budget cuts). This applies to all families even if you are currently receiving UIFSM (universal infant free school meals). Free School Meals can be awarded if parents/carers are in receipt of:

- * Income Support
- * Income Based Job Seekers Allowance
- * Income Related Employment and Support Allowance
- * Child Tax Credit (providing your annual income is less that £16,190)
- * Guarantee Element of State Pension Credit
- * Support Under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- * Working Tax Credit 'run on'

*Universal Credit.

Please note, if you currently receive Working Tax Credit, you are
not eligible to Claim Free School Meals. However, if you become
unemployed or reduce weekly working hours below 16, you can
claim Free School Meals for a 4 week period after employment
ceases or hours reduced.

They have been fantastic getting used to new routines. In English, we looked at Roald Dahl characters and had great fun reading about Mr and Mrs Twit and Mrs Trunchball. Welcome to Foxes! It has been a great first week in Foxes. The children have returned with great enthusiasm and on Monday our Year 6s enjoyed meeting their buddies again. In class the children have started their new topic of "Transatlantic Travels" and have been looking closely at the continent of South America. After revising the continents and oceans of the world, the children used an atlas to locate the countries in South America before plotting their capital cities. They then researched their chosen country finding out key information such as: the currency, the area, the population, the language and their flag. They then created fact files which will be displayed around the school.

In their first session of Forest School with Ms Rankin, the children discussed our Golden Rules of Being Respectful, Staying Safe and always Trying our Best, and how they apply to Forest School. They also revised using tools, before they each made a disk out of wood with a key message on to display in the Forest School area.

We like to get the children outside in all weathers for playtime and lunchtime and if they don't have a coat they will not be allowed outside if its wet or cold.


Also a gentle reminder that trainers are only to be worn for PE as they are not part of our every day school uniform.
