
In topic we found out about the discovery of the Sutton Hoo and looked at images of a range of items which were found and what it can teach us about life in Anglo-Saxon times.

On Thursday, Foxes went on their school trip to Winchester Science Centre and Planetarium to finish their topic of 'Reach for the Stars'. Firstly, we visited the planetarium with its 360° cinema screen. We relaxed in our seats and flew through the Solar System learning lots about stars, constellations and planets.

Next, we had time to explore the 'sound, hearing and vibration' interactive exhibits where the children discovered a range of engaging activities that brought Science to life. They played on a 10m long guitar, made sounds in huge echo tubes and investigated the density of different liquids.

Finally, the children were tasked with making rockets as a team. They had to work together to build, test and improve their rockets, before watching them fly across the room, powered by fuel and fire. All the children (and adults) had lots of fun and it was a great way to end our topic.

#### **Covid Cases**

Covid cases locally are on the increase, and we are aware that there is a growing number of COVID cases in our local schools.

To protect everyone please remember that if your child has symptoms of COVID then they should not come to school. You should book a PCR test (not take a lateral flow which are not suitable for primary-aged children) and await the results before your child returns to school. The results should be reported by email to office@bourton.dorset.sch.uk

If a member of your household has tested positive for COVID, you must book a PCR test for all members of the household. Your child can come to school whilst you await the result if they have NO symptoms. You should inform school that there is a positive case in your household and inform them of your child's result as soon as it is received.

Anyone with a confirmed positive case should be self-isolating and any adult in the household that has not been double vaccinated must also self-isolate.

# **Online Safety**

### **SQUID GAMES/ROBLOX**

Netflix's Squid Games is a South Korean thriller that features scenes of brutal violence and is rated 15 by the BBFC. It follows a group of adults who compete to win innocent-looking playground games, but who are killed if they do not succeed at the tasks.

Squid Game's popularity is beginning to spread across various online platforms. There has been a slew of content created – ranging from memes to apps – that convey the violence of the show, so it is important for parents, carers and educators to understand the basis of Squid Game and the potential risks to young people who might be exposed to it.

Squid Game's 15 rating has not prevented clips and images from the show being uploaded onto social media sites such as TikTok, with the #SquidGame hashtag being viewed more than 22.8 billion times.

There have been reports of children who have accounts on these platforms inadvertently viewing gory, explicit scenes from the programme, and parents and carers should be mindful of the prevalence of these uploads. Roblox have now developed games based on the Squid Games thriller.

We know that Roblox is popular with children so ask parents to be aware of the content.
