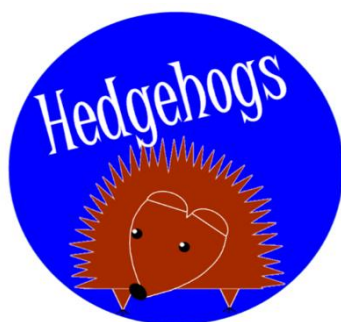

## Squirrels News

Squirrels started off the week with a super Rugby session which focused on our three values of thankfulness, kindness and perseverance. The children thoroughly enjoyed persevering to capture the tags, returning them with kindness and saying thank you for their returned tags. In English, we began our focus on dictionaries and alphabetical order. We have been singing the alphabet to the tune of Auld Lang Syne so we can hear each letter clearly and identify any mistakes in the order. We wrote definitions for our favourite toys and made a class dictionary of toys. In maths we have been counting in tens, representing numbers using a variety of resources and reasoning about numbers. We have started our Toys topic and began by looking at the movement of toys. We practised making mechanisms with card and split pins ready to design our own toy movements. We learnt the language of *pivot*, *lever* and *guide* and I was very impressed with the children's perseverance when trying make their mechanism move. In Science we have been looking at the weather and how it changes for different seasons. The weather has been so changeable this week - it's been perfect! We hope you have a lovely weekend.

## Badgers News

This week Badgers have been learning more about invaders and settlers. In Topic they considered why invaders came to Britain and learnt about the different Anglo-Saxon kingdoms. In Forest schools they considered what settlers would need and started to build their own settlements in the school grounds. The children also had a fun time in Science on the front playground, exploring how well items move on different surfaces.

In English we read the story of Arthur and the Golden Rope and considered the plot points of a quest story. We then looked at other quest stories to see if they follow the same structure. We also enjoyed reading lots of extracts of Roald Dahl stories to celebrate Roald Dahl day at the beginning of the week.

It has been another busy week in Foxes. On Monday we welcomed Chris from Project Touchline into school and the children enjoyed their first tag rugby session. The session focussed on our three Christian Values of "kindness", "perseverance" and "thankfulness" and how they can be incorporated into sport.

In Maths this week we have been looking at numbers up to 10 million. The children have made the numbers using place value counters, ordered numbers from smallest to biggest, compared numbers as well as solved problems involving 5-, 6- and 7- digits. We have had lots of "Persevering Penguins" in class as they came across challenges they were unsure about but didn't give up.

Finally, in Art, we have been focussing on the Moon as part of our "Reach for the Stars" topic. We discussed what the surface of the Moon might be like by looking at different images, before the children used different sketching pencils to draw it.

### **NUT FREE SCHOOL**

## Attendance Information

Today we have sent home an Attendance letter. This letter is in line with Dorset Council policy and is followed by all Dorset Schools. The law states that "If a child of compulsory school age who is a registered pupil at a school fails to attend regularly at the school, his parent is guilty of an offence." S444(1) Education Act, 1996.

Following the Covid pandemic it is crucial for the children to attend so we can ensure no further learning is missed. Please note that 10 sessions or more in a 12-week period will be referred to Dorset Council, this includes holidays in term time. Obviously, we all know that children can be poorly, and we have specific codes for Covid-19 related absences so please let your class teacher know if there is anything they should be aware of or speak to me if you have any questions.

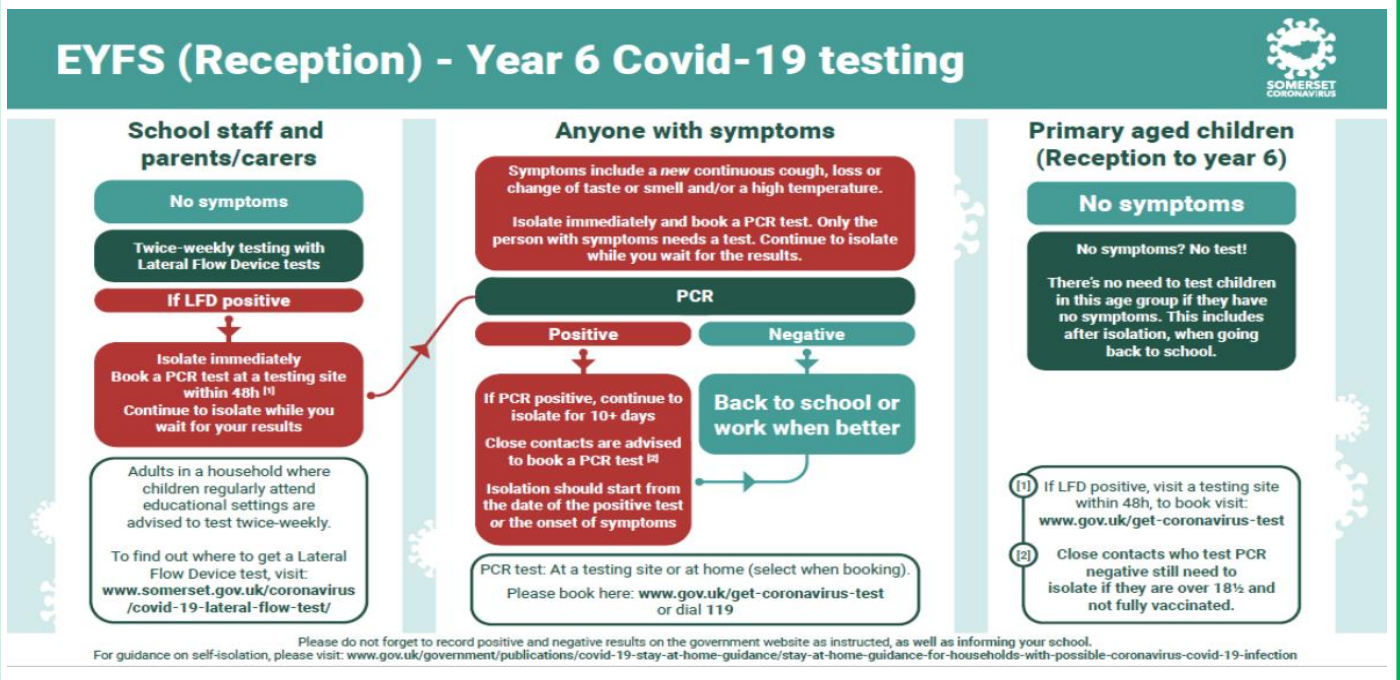
We have had numerous requests this week for holidays in term time. We are not able to authorise term time holidays including days added onto weekends. Every day counts for two sessions in school so days added onto a weekend can increase your child's absence by 4 sessions.

The government have said that any child with below 90% attendance is a Persistent Absentee. This is a very low level of attendance and cause for serious concern. We want to prevent any child's attendance falling to this level and have a target attendance of 97%.

## Car Park Reminders

The car park is for STAFF and Visitors parking only. As this is the main walkway through for our youngest children, please don't attempt to park in the car park. ALSO PLEASE DO NOT park near the BIG BLUE GATES or next to the grass bank next to the church. There are solid white lines in the middle of the road and by parking here you are forcing other road users to cross the white lines to pass—causing a risk to other vehicles on the brow of the hill.

## Free School Meals

Please can I encourage parents to apply for Free School Meals, if you are eligible? You do not have to have the meals but eligibility may mean that some trips are significantly cheaper for these families, and children eligible for Free School Meals attract additional funding to the school (which is important at this time of budget cuts). This applies to all families even if you are currently receiving UIFSM (universal infant free school meals). Free School Meals can be awarded if parents/carers are in receipt of:

- \* Income Support
- \* Income Based Job Seekers Allowance
- \* Income Related Employment and Support Allowance
- \* Child Tax Credit (providing your annual income is less than £16,190)
- \* Guarantee Element of State Pension Credit
- \* Support Under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- \* Working Tax Credit 'run on'
- \* Universal Credit.

Please note, if you currently receive Working Tax Credit, you are not eligible to claim Free School Meals. However, if you become unemployed or reduce weekly working hours below 16, you can claim Free School Meals for a 4 week period after employment ceases or hours reduced.

The Application process is now open for applying for School places for September 2022. If you have a child due to transfer to secondary school or if you have a 3/4 year old due to start school please check the website of your home County for details.

### New School Year Reminders

### Uniform
