Warm Weather

Squirrels News

Another incredibly busy week in Squirrels! On Wednesday we had the Life Education Lady join us for a session where we learnt all about being healthy and healthy foods. The children were very excited to see Harold the Giraffe and learnt lots about their bodies using an interactive programme on the whiteboard. In English, we looked at another 'Overcoming the monster' Tale... The 3 Billy Goats Gruff. We rewrote the story, looking at how to use question marks and exclamation marks in stories, without forgetting our full-stops and capital letters! In Maths we have been revising addition using a number square as well as tens and ones. The year 2s have also started to look at the more formal ways of laying out the calculation. We continued our DT project about healthy eating by taste testing different vegetables, describing their look, smell and taste. Lots of children tried all of the vegetables on offer. In Science the children planted a bean and are going to watch them grow over this term, making detailed observations. In PSHE we have been looking at changes in seasons as well as how plants change as they grow. Have a lovely weekend everyone.

Badgers News

We've had a super busy week in Badgers this week with a visit from Life Education Scarf on Wednesday and our first Ukulele lesson on Thursday. However, our week started on Tuesday with an exploration of Ancient Egyptian tombs. Our classroom was transformed into tunnels. We took it in turns to crawl down the tunnels and at the end we discovered the sarcophagus of Tutankhamun surrounded by treasure. We were archaeologist trying to learn more about his life. We found four Canopic jars, a scarab beetle, hunting sticks, a golden fan and heaps of gold including edible golden coins! We then wrote a diary extract of one of the Egyptologists writing about their experience. In the afternoon, we followed an instructional text to mummify tomatoes. We have left these in the teacher's cupboard and are looking forward to checking on them in a few weeks' time. We then had great fun having a go at covering someone in our house with bandages (or toilet roll!) like a mummy. Finally we investigated how many cubes of stone would be used to make pyramids of different heights. This is the closest we were going to get to a field trip for our topic and the children had a wonderful day.

In Foxes, on Wednesday, we had a visit from the Life Education Van and the children took part in a "Friends" workshop. They learnt how to be assertive when friends put pressure on you by: keeping eye contact, being friendly and relaxed, smiling and giving reasons why. The children played out situations when these skills might be needed in mini role-plays.

In Forest School with Ms Rankin, the children decided to survey the school site for worms in different places. They dug 20cm pits, and then using mustard water, tried to coax out the deeper burrowing worms. Lots of mature and immature worms were discovered and then looked closely at with magnifying glasses. Finally, they discussed how important worms are to our world.
