What is Safeguarding?

All the adults at St George's School think that children's health, safety, and welfare are very important.

In our school, we respect all our children and help to protect their rights.

We do our best to help children make excellent progress in their learning.

We teach children how to recognise risks in different situations and how to protect themselves and stay safe.

How are children protected at St George's School?

We provide a safe environment for children to learn in: where everyone has the right to feel **SAFE**; the right to **LEARN** without undue distraction or disruption; the right to **RESPECT**.

We help to ensure that children remain safe, at home as well as at school.

We think it is important for our children to know where to get help if they are worried or unhappy about something.
