

Huge congratulations to our Year 6 children who have worked so hard putting all their learning into practise this week in their end of Key Stage assessments. We have been extremely proud of the way in which the children have taken these tasks on board, especially after two years of interrupted learning. We could not have asked for more, they did us and you proud. A big thank you from the children goes to Mr Abbott who coordinated and led the SATs breakfasts this week – toast, juice and croissants served every morning! Well done to all the children and staff involved.

Next week our Year 2 children will also be undertaking their end of Key Stage 1 SATs papers. These are entirely different to the Year 6 papers. They are completed in a totally different manner, in fact the children are often unaware that they have done them. The papers are completed in normal class circumstances and are marked in school by our own staff. The children's end of year assessments are derived by taking the teacher assessment of the class teacher, with the SAT results used to support this.

During the first week in June, the Year 1 children will also complete the phonics screening check. This is a "test" to see how well the children have developed their phonic skills over the first two years of learning in school. The "test" is made up of real words and alien words; words that are made up to see how the children apply their pure phonic skills.

This year for the first time, the Year 4 children will be completing a Times Tables Check as well. The check will take place after the half term holiday and will see how their times table learning has gone. The check will test the children on multiplication and division facts up to 12x12. This is the first year that every Year 4 child in the country will complete the check, so it is a bit of an unknown!

All of these assessments are for the single purpose of allowing the Department for Education to judge the effectiveness of the school, they have little impact on the children's progress and we will make sure that they effect the children's everyday school lives as little as possible.

At St George's we celebrate how all of our children shine in different ways! We are proud of our full, broad and balanced curriculum on offer for all our children and are keen to develop fond memories for all our children during their time with us.

#### **Swimming Pool**

You may have noticed that last night a group of Swimming Pool Elves worked tirelessly cleaning the pool. A huge thank you to them all. It now needs a coat of paint to freshen it up before being refilled so if you can spare some time on Monday 16<sup>th</sup> May from 5pm please come along to help. Even if you can only spare half an hour, many hands make light work! We are extremely lucky to have our own Swimming Pool at St George's and we do rely on volunteers help get it up and running as well as supporting the lessons each week. If you are able to help please look out for a Swimming Volunteer Information letter with a link to let us know if you can help. Help is needed in all classes so if you are only available on certain days please check where help is needed.

## Squirrels News


In Squirrels we have been super Planning Pandas this week. We have planned our own 'Overcoming the Monster' story and then written it. We have continued to work on sentence punctuation, including fullstops, question marks and exclamation marks. The Year 2s have also tried to include some inverted commas (speech marks). I am looking forward to reading the stories to share with you in our assembly. We have also been planning our salads for a friend. We interviewed our friends to find out their favourite vegetables and designed a salad plate based around their choices. In maths, we have moved on to subtraction, revising using tens and ones as well as the rekenreks. We also worked hard to subtract crossing the tens boundary by using a variety of resources. Year 2s have also represented this using pictorial representations of tens and ones. In PE we have been learning the basic striking, sending and receiving skills. In Badgers this week we have been detectives! We used images of items which were found in Ancient Egyptians tombs and we found out what they were. #### Covid Update

Thank you once again for everything you have done so far over the last two years to keep us all safe. It really is very much appreciated. The latest Government advice for schools, and the NHS, states that should you test positive for Covid, then:
