Today we raised funds for Children in Need by coming to school wearing spots and home clothes. This year marks the 40th Anniversary of the first televised Children in Need fundraiser. Thank you for your generous donations we raised a total of £156.26.









As I said last week, I am really please schools have remained open during this latest lockdown. The guidance has been updated and new information for parents' guidance has been published. Our risk assessment has been amended. For the period of this lockdown our focus needs to be on keeping the school community as safe and well as possible during the working day and so the following reminders to help that happen:

- **FACE COVERINGS**: Thank you to all parents who have chosen to wear a mask whilst gathering outside school. I would still like to remind those who have not chosen to do this to reconsider (unless you are exempt) for the safety of our children and everyone else.
- Staff members will wear a face covering when having a conversation with a parent/carer at the gate.
- **FAMILIES MIXING**: A reminder that families should NOT mix outside the school gates during drop off and pick-up times including on the play area after school, we are in a lockdown situation at present. I appreciate this is difficult and thank you for your support in this.
- **NUMBERS BY THE GATE**: Also, a reminder that we ask that only ONE parent/carer drops off and picks up to minimise the amount of people gathering outside of our school.
- **VOLUNTEERS AND VISITORS**: During this period of lock down we have stopped all volunteers into school.
- Visitors have been kept to essential visitors only and they wear a face covering and remind socially distanced from staff and children in school.

#### **Microsoft Teams**

In the case of a bubble closure due to Covid we will be using Teams for all our home learning.

To help iron out any issues we are having a trial week beginning 23<sup>rd</sup> November, where Spellings and Mental Math's will be shared on Teams instead of paper.

It doesn't accept common passwords so please choose a selection of capital/lower case letters as well as numbers and symbols. When you change this please make a note of it on the sticker, they have in their reading record/workbook so that it isn't forgotten.

In Hedgehogs this week, we have been looking at special days. On Monday, we finished off our work on Bonfire Night, writing about the sights and sounds of fireworks.
