Parent's Evening—Book Via our new eSchools app.

In order to continually improve the way, we communicate with our families and carers we have bought into a new online communication app which includes a booking system for parent's evening. The app is run by eSchools; the same platform we use for our school website. Bookings for parents evening need to be made by downloading the eSchools app. The app is free and easy to download for both Android and Apple phones. You can also log in via our website.

Today your child has come home with a letter containing your login and password details along with instructions for downloading the app. Please look in your child's book bags.

Once you have downloaded the app and logged in you will have access to other information such as your child's attendance and school messages and notifications as well as parent's evening bookings.

You will be able to log in and book a slot to meet your child's teacher from <u>**Tuesday 25th October**</u>. Booking will close on <u>**Thursday 3rd November.**</u> Using the app gives you the flexibility to book your chosen appointment time. After the booking window closes the app will not allow parents to book a slot

In Squirrels this week we completed our unit on instructional texts, using all our knowledge of the features to write a set of instructions for a made-up meal for the Giant of Jum. In maths we have moved on to addition and learned how to write the addition calculations from different representations, including part-part whole models. Each day we have a Mastering Number session which aims to develop good number sense. We use rekenreks in these sessions to help us (a small abacus with 20 beads). The year 1s were working on 1 more and 1 less, working together to visualise the steps using cubes. The year 2s were working on odd and even numbers. On Wednesday we had a lovely session with the author of Handa's Surprise, Eileen Browne who read her book to us and talked about writing stories. It was very exciting. In Art we created our mini fruit from salt dough to go into our fruit bowl and when they were baked, we painted them. They will be coming home today for you to see!


We want to revamp the front outdoor area for the children and would like some volunteers to help paint the fences, the playhouse and the revamp the houses by the play boat area.

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
