

## Squirrels News

This week Squirrels (and Hedgehogs) had a fabulous trip to the Fleet Air Arm Museum, Yeovilton. The children had an amazing time. We tried on uniforms through the ages, sat in an ejector seat, climbed inside a Sea King helicopter and walked through a Concorde from tail to tip! We also went on a simulated helicopter ride to land on an aircraft carrier where we watched a plane land. It was very noisy! We even got to see a model of the Kitty Hawk by the Wright Brothers; The children knew all about this from our history sessions. The children were a delight and thoroughly enjoyed the day – especially the play park at the end! A special shout out to those who joined us and helped on the trip; thank you Mrs Coward, Mrs Ridout, Mrs Hibberd, Mr Harvey, Mrs LaTrobe-Bateman and Mr P. Manley.

In Forest School, we furthered our exploration of flying things by making our own willow and tissue frisbees. They flew pretty well! The children worked hard collaborating to support each other with the making skills. After that we planted up some vegetable seeds – radishes, courgettes and red peppers. ## **Badgers News**

In Badgers this week, we had lots of fun completing our models of a predator with opening jaws powered by a balloon. We had snapping crocodiles, a hungry wolf, a smiling panther and a sly fox and even a Venus fly try! The children had to overcome problems which occurred during the making process and considered how they would change their design in the future. In English we wrote our own 'Defeating the Monster Tales'. The children had to come up with creative ways to destroy their beast and tried hard to use different strategies to create suspense for the reader. In PE the children worked in groups to create a dance to the finale of the 'Carnival of the Animals', putting together all our movements and skills from the previous sessions. In Forest School, we co-created a chocolate cake. It was exciting seeing how we could bake in our cast iron dutch oven over the fire; we put hot coals on the lid to create an all round hot 'blanket' effect.



## Foxes News

In Foxes this week in Maths, the children have been finding percentages of amounts. They initially divided their whole number by 10 to find 10% and then used this to find 20%, 30% etc... Then they progressed to finding 1% by dividing by 100 and used this number to find percentages such as 27%. There were lots of "concentrating camels".

In Forest School, Foxes enjoyed a carousel of activities including giving the beds a good weed, as well as planting summer bulbs, vegetable seeds, strawberries, raspberries and trees! They also made bows, using hazel and string; they whittled v-shaped notches in the sticks to help create tension in the bowstring. Next week we'll see if they work!

Finally, in PE we have been focussing on the sport of cricket. The children perfected the skill of over-arm bowling to one another before transferring those skills to aim at the stumps. We have lots of young cricketers in the making.

#### **ROAD CLOSURE WARNING**


Wessex Water will be carrying out essential repairs to a water main starting on Monday 4<sup>th</sup> April. The ageing pipes need replacing to ensure the local area has improved water quality. And a more reliable supply. The planned works begin on Monday 4<sup>th</sup> April with a compound just North of the A303 flyover (near school) being set up in preparation for a planned ROAD CLOSURE.

The work involves closing a section of West Bourton Road, from just past Brickyard Lane in the north to just before the A303 flyover in the south. Wessex Water will be using a technique where they make small excavations to minimise inconvenience. A diversion, using New Road and the B3081 will be in place and these alternative routes will be clearly signposted.

Please see road closure and diversion route for further details.

The work itself will begin **Monday 11 April 2022.** They expect it to be completed by **Friday 27 May 2022** so the main restrictions will be in place after the school Easter Holiday. Access will be limited and therefore we are asking parents to park further away from the school site and walk to school.

Please DO NOT park on the brow of the hill next to the Church to ensure access to the blue gate is safe for all our children. Access around school will be maintained for residents, although it may be restricted at times so our suggestion is to avoid using Church Track and the West Bourton Road at drop off and pick up times to enable access for residents only.



#### Woodland Trust Trees

We have been very lucky as a school to receive 30 trees from the Woodland Trust as part of their plant a woodland campaign. During this week Foxes have been busy planting the trees. The children talked about the importance of tree planting and how every tree makes a difference. We need trees to support biodiversity in our ecosystems - for birds, bee, and bugs. They provide us with materials to use and fruit to eat as well. We also need trees to help benefit the climate as each tree helps to absorb carbon dioxide and emit oxygen for us. We have planted a mixture of Rowan, Silver birch and Wild Cherry. We will care for them and hopefully watch them mature into full grown trees over time.

#### **Parents Evening and Parent Survey**

Many thanks to those of you who attended our parents evening last week either in person, over the phone or via video call. I know the staff really appreciated the time you took to talk about your child's progress and celebrate their successes.

We would also like to say thank you to everyone who also completed our Parent survey. The results were overwhelmingly positive with our strengths being identified as being welcoming, having a community feel and being supportive of all our children; treating them as individuals. Our curriculum offer was also identified as a strength of the school. All the comments have been read and the Governors discussed the results of the survey at this week's Full Board Meeting.
