In Outdoor learning, Hedgehogs used their fine motor skills to make wire bird feeders and then to squeeze seed and lard into cups to make a tasty feeding station for the birds. Squirrels News

Squirrels started this week off with an exciting Forest School session of making soup. They learnt about healthy eating and worked in small groups to chop and peel their vegetables. After that they added the vegetables to the pot to be cooked over the fire. Thank you so much to those parents who came in to help Ms Rankin this week. The children had a tasting session the next day during snack time and there were many empty cups!

In English, we have innovated our story of Lost and Found, changing the main characters and events so that it has an Arctic theme. We had narwhals appearing in baths and polar bears standing at the windows – all very exciting. The children wrote their stories using their innovated story maps and then used their purple pens to improve them. In maths we have been working on number bonds and learning our number bonds to ten by heart. The year 2s have been learning about using our number bonds to ten when adding larger numbers. In Science we grouped animals into mammals, fish, birds, amphibians, reptiles and insects, beginning to look at the characteristics of each group. Have a good weekend everyone.



Badgers News

In Badgers this week we familiarised ourselves even more with different countries in Europe and their location. We made a quiz for others to guess our mystery country and used geographical clues such as: It is a landlocked country in Southern Europe which borders Austria, Romania and Croatia. (Answers on a postcard please!)

In Maths, we focused on our times tables knowledge, particularly x8 facts and x7. We considered the difference between sharing and grouping when dividing, using these number facts. We also wrote and solved number stories involving multiplication and division. Today we also thought about 3D shapes, making them from marshmallow and spaghetti and identified the vertices, faces and edges.

We explored simple circuits in Science and had fun lighting a bulb. We considered which components are essential to make a complete circuit and how the circuits can vary.

Foxes News

This week in English, the children in Foxes have been focussing on the story of Lego. They watched a video about the struggles that its creator Ole Christiansen was faced with, and how he showed perseverance and great courage to overcome them. They then wrote detailed reports about it, which are going to be displayed in the school corridor.

In our "that's so last century" topic work we have been comparing the 1950s to today, and discussed what has changed and what is still the same. The children enjoyed looking at pictures of 1950s classrooms and debated whether classrooms are better today.

Finally, in Forest School with Ms Rankin the children have been focussing on British birds. Firstly, in class, the children discussed British birds they knew and completed a quiz – Ms Rankin was impressed by the children's initial knowledge. Afterwards, they went outside and worked as teams to create hanging food for birds that they have now been placed in the Forest School Area. It has been another productive week in Foxes. Covid Update

We continue to encourage members of our school community to test regularly with Lateral Flow Tests to help prevent the spread of COVID19. Staff are continuing to test on a regular basis.

We currently have 3 confirmed positive cases in school. Most of the people who have tested positive have had no symptoms or very mild symptoms, similar to a cold and it has only been through regular testing that positive cases have been identified.

Please remember if your child displays any of the following symptoms:

- Continuous cough,
- High temperature
- Loss/change of taste or smell

They MUST stay at home and get a PCR test.

From Monday 17th January, people who are selfisolating with Covid 19 will have the option to reduce their isolation period after 5 full days if they test negative with a Lateral Flow Device (LFD) on both day 5 and day 6 and they do not have a temperature.

The test can be taken on day five (not before). If it is negative, another test can be taken 24 hours later, on day six. Assuming this is also negative – and you do not have a temperature – you can immediately leave isolation.

If the LFD tests between day 5 and day 9 are positive you will need to keep self-isolating until day 10 as before, and only end your isolation if you do not have a temperature.



Coming Soon: Children's Mental Health Week

Just to make you aware that this half term it will be **Children's Mental Health Week**. It is taking place on **7-13th February 2022 (Week 6)**. This year's theme is **Growing Together**.

We will be encouraging children (and adults) to consider how they have grown, and how they can help others to grow. **Growing Together** is about growing emotionally and finding ways to help each other grow. Challenges and setbacks can help us to grow and adapt and trying new things can help us to move beyond our comfort zone into a new realm of possibility and potential. However, emotional growth is often a gradual process that happens over time, and sometimes we might feel a bit 'stuck'.

On Friday 4th February we will be taking part in the NSPCC's Number Day.

The children will be spending the day carrying out fun filled number activities and games as well as taking part in a House Challenge.
