

What a week!

This week, as you know, we have unfortunately had a rapid rise in positive Covid cases across the school. Thank you to those families and staff who have taken a PCR test to check, even if your child did not have symptoms.

I'd also like to thank all the staff for working so incredibly hard this week; making sure everyone is safe, happy and continuing to learn despite the additional challenges. Many have stepped in to cover additional roles during staff absence – we really do have a fabulous staff team at St George's! A reminder from the letters we sent out this week:

If your child is awaiting a PCR test result and DOES HAVE SYMPTOMS (or if they are unwell with other illness)– they DO need to isolate until they receive a negative result and SHOULD NOT attend school as normal.

Can we also kindly ask that you inform the school office of PCR results as soon as you receive them whether the result is positive or negative.

I absolutely understand that the ever-changing guidance can be very confusing but we are working closely with Public Health Dorset to ensure that we have the most up to date information and guidance. We have put in additional measures for the next two weeks to attempt to limit the rate of transmission. These measures include social distancing at drop off and pick up times, wearing of face coverings when dropping off and picking up, **NO after school clubs for two weeks**, virtual assemblies and meetings, additional cleaning measures, no visitors into school, separate bubbles at playtimes and lunchtimes and increased ventilation within school.

We will get through this if we all play our part – you, me, us & everyone. This is very frustrating for all of us – although the children's outlook is positive and they haven't lost their love of learning!

Our priorities continue to be the safety of our children, staff and families and hope that those who have tested positive keep well. Thank you to those of you who have taken the time to send messages of support for all we are doing at school – it really does mean a lot to all of us.

If you have any concerns, please do contact the School Office where we are very happy to talk it through with you.

In the meantime, sending hugs (albeit virtual) and lots of love (and schoolwork!) to the children (and staff) who are isolating at home and looking forward to seeing you soon! Jill

Squirrels News

In Squirrels this week, we finished writing our poems about bonfires using our senses and then wrote our own poem about fireworks, editing them to produce our best poem for the display in the classroom. The Word Womble was very impressed with the fantastic language the children used to describe their feelings and the sights and sounds of the fireworks. In Maths we have been focussing on addition. The Year 1s have been representing addition using ten frames, part-part whole models and learning about bar models too. The Year 2s have been looking at the pattern of adding and subtracting tens from 2-digit numbers using a 100 square, base 10 and arrow cards. We have also been measuring mass using balance scales. In RE we have looked at the symbols of peace and on Wednesday we made poppies for Remembrance Day, when we held our 2 minutes silence outside. Mr Malleson joined us playing the Cornet. In Science we have revised our body parts and labelled them. We have continued to learn about the Great Fire of London, finding out how the fire started, how it spread so quickly and how it was stopped.
